Notification of Stahlheber Road Closing

The Butler County Engineer's Office wishes to inform you that Stahlheber Road will close five feet east of Gene Avenue and 0.3 mile west of Brunner Road for a culvert replacement beginning Monday, March 27, 2017. The road is tentatively scheduled to reopen the week of April 24, 2017, weather permitting.

The Project

This project is necessary to replace an aging and deteriorating culvert in an effort to prevent potential future structural failure and maintain proper drainage and water flow. All work is being performed by crews from the Butler County Engineer's Office and funding for the project consists of 100 percent local BCEO funds.

Detour and Maintenance of Traffic

During this closure, local access to Stahlheber Road will be maintained for residents and businesses from either side of the culvert, but motorists will not be permitted to pass across the culvert or enter the construction zone. Detours will be posted for all thru traffic.

Eastbound Stahlheber Road traffic will detour north on Boyle Road, east on Ohio 130, south on Ohio 177 (Main Street) in Hamilton, and west on Washington Boulevard to Stahlheber. Westbound traffic will reverse this route.

Please note that all dates are approximate and may vary due to weather and other factors out of our control which can affect the schedule. The best way for local motorists to stay informed is to check the Road Closings page on the BCEO web site at www.bceo.org/roadclosings. Emergency personnel, school bus transportation officials, the post office, and the media have been notified of this upcoming closure.
